Participants spend a day on CROW's campus with members of the medical staff, students, and volunteers to learn about the wildlife that call Southwest Florida home and observe a sampling of medical demonstrations to show how injuries and illnesses are treated in the hospital. The camp curriculum meets Florida's Next Generation Science Standards for content and dissection.
